**Cinderella (**La Cenerentola) Rossini July 12, 19, 26 Welcome to Pocket Opera's exciting 2020 season! This marks our 43rd year presenting grand opera on an intimate scale to Bay Area audiences. Our theme for this year is "A 20/20 Vision For the Future." 2019 proved to be our most artistically successful season ever, with more performances reviewed to critical acclaim than ever before; it also was a record year for fundraising and audience growth. This has propelled us into the next decade with renewed energy and excitement. It was our first full season with our new team in place. Jeffrey Jordan, Executive Director, and Chung-Wai Soong, General Manager, have been instrumental in creating the success that we hope to build upon for 2020.

What does our 20/20 vision include? We will be expanding our Pocket Philharmonic from eight players to nine or ten, depending on the show. In the coming years I hope to expand the budget to allow for an orchestra of ten for every performance. Part of our fundraising drive this year will be dedicated to expanding orchestra rehearsal time, to ensure that our musical standards continue to exceed audience expectations. We have given a much-deserved pay increase to our singers, so that we can attract the best talent in the area. Even our look will change. The main curtain will be closed when audiences first arrive, and a new orchestra layout will allow the action onstage to draw the audience more fully into the story.

And what stories! We start the season with Mozart's masterpiece, Don Giovanni. Anders Froehlich, seen at San Francisco Opera as The Spanish Sailor in Moby Dick and Ed in It's a Wonderful Life, will sing the title role. He will be joined by fellow SF Opera singers Chris Filipowicz (Leporello) and Mitchell Jones (Masetto). Sara LeMesh, fresh off her triumph as Bess in Breaking the Waves at West Edge Opera, will sing the role of Zerlina in her Pocket Opera debut. Next up will be our double bill, Cavalleria Rusticana paired with The Cat Became a Woman. That will be followed by an opera that we have only tackled once, thirty years ago— Wagner's early work, No Love Allowed (Das Liebesverbot), which will be helmed by Jonathan Khuner. The season continues with audience favorite, Carmen, and closes with another coproduction with our colleagues at Cinnabar Theater, Rossini's Cinderella (La Cenerentola).

Thrilling new talent, brilliant new musical and stage directors, musical and dramatic excellence—all of this highlights our 20/20 Vision. We hope you'll join us as we embark on a new decade of intimate opera in English.

From all of us here at Pocket Opera—our Board, artists, Donald, Jeffrey, Chung-Wai, and me—we thank you for your continued support. It is our honor and pleasure to have an audience like you!

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


# Monthly Giving Program
