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

# A message from the General Director

## To Our Beloved Audience,

Pocket Opera is thrilled to welcome you back to another season of live theater! We kick off the year with one of my personal favorite operettas, Johann Strauss' Die Fledermaus. Audiences always love the catchy tunes and comedic romp of this mainstay of the operatic repertoire. But our particular production has even more to recommend it.

Our stage director is the incomparable Madeline Abel-Kerns. Many of you will remember Madeline from her time onstage and directing past Pocket productions. In fact, over twenty-five years ago, Madeline was the director for The Tales of Hoffmann, which was my very first time performing in the chorus at Pocket—actually, my first professional opera gig ever. Madeline essentially created the Pocket Opera directing style: efficient, minimal, with a great respect for both the music and the English text. I am delighted to have her back after more than two decades away.

Conversely, we have a brilliant young music director joining us for the first time. Paul Dab brings his talent as a collaborative pianist, his deep love of working with singers, and his focused attention to bringing out all the colors and details in the score with our Pocket Philharmonic. Paul has been a delight to work with, and I know we'll be seeing more of him at Pocket Opera.

Similarly, in this production we have cast and orchestra members who have been in dozens of Pocket shows dating back to the 80s, and five singers and four instrumentalists making their Pocket Opera debut! It's exciting to anchor Pocket in our traditions, while pushing forward into a new era of making art.

Lastly, this year we say goodbye to our longtime Orchestra Contractor, Diana Dorman, who has retired. Diana has been with Pocket for decades, and we are sure you'll still see her in the audience, enjoying a show. We welcome Nicola Gruen as our new Orchestra Contractor with this, her inaugural show in the role.

Now, please sit back and delight in the pleasure that is live theater here at Pocket Opera!

Chung-Wai's extensive repertoire includes world premieres by David Chesworth (Sabat Jesus); Lisa Bielawa's groundbreaking opera, Vireo; Elijah (Meira Warshauer's Elijah's Violin). Concert soloist in works of Bach, Fauré, Mozart, Dvořák, Berlioz, Handel, Beethoven's Choral Fantasy under Kurt Masur, also performed at Ojai Festival with Jeremy Denk. Operatic roles include Mityukha (Boris Godunov - San Francisco Symphony), Erster Nazarener (Salome), Sadistic Sailor (Breaking the Waves), Melchior (Amahl and the Night Visitors - Hawaii Opera Theatre), Un vieux paysan (Ariane et Barbe Bleue - West Edge Opera). Upcoming engagements include Marco (Gianni Schicchi - Hawaii Opera Theatre), and Chamberlain (Le Rossignol - West Edge Opera).

# **A Pocket Magic Flute**

Our work continues on an exciting, groundbreaking project, Pocket Opera's animated/live-action hybrid program. We have completed filming of the live-action sequences and are nearly halfway through the animation process. Our youth orchestra recorded the score in February, and our team is hard at work on the study guides that will accompany this educational program.



Set in Africa, this retelling of Mozart's masterpiece features an all-Black cast, and a predominantly Black (and largely female) creative team.

#### Nicola Gruen Orchestra Contractor

Nicola first performed violin in Pocket Opera with Donald Pippin while a UC Berkeley undergraduate. She studied violin performance at the Royal Academy of Music and performed for several years in the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, Halle Orchestra, Ulster Orchestra, Bournemouth Symphony and English National Ballet and on film soundtracks such as Baz Luhrmann's Moulin Rouge. After freelancing for ten years on the East Coast, Nicola returned to the Bay Area in 2012 and has been performing regularly with Pocket Opera and regional orchestras. When she's not performing, Nicola works full time in gifts and endowments at the University of California.

#### Nicolas A. Garcia General Director

Nicolas began his career with Pocket Opera over twenty five years ago in the chorus of *Tales of Hoffmann*. Since then he has gone on to perform many roles with many companies throughout the Bay Area and beyond. Nicolas began his directing career fifteen years ago, again, right here at Pocket Opera. Over those years, he worked as Assistant Director at Opera San José, Michigan Opera Theatre, and for several productions at San Diego Opera. In

2017 he worked at the Royal Swedish Opera as Associate Director on their production of *La Cenerentola*.





#### Cheryl Cain Rosalinde

Cheryl Cain, soprano, has sung with the San Francisco Symphony since 2006, the San Francisco Opera since 2013, American Bach Soloists, Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra & Chorale, and many other professional ensembles. She has her Master of Music degree from the Manhattan School of Music, and her Bachelor of Music degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. She continued her post-graduate studies in opera in Florence, Italy. She is a member of the American Guild of Musical Artists and the National Association of Teachers of Singing. She is delighted to be making her Pocket Opera debut as Rosalinde in *Die Fledermaus*.



#### Patrick Hagen Eisenstein

Patrick Hagen, a lyric tenor, has been lauded for his "deep, curled tone" and "expressive" vocalism, and has been seen in many operatic productions on both East and West coasts. Favorites include The Magician (Menotti's *The Consul*), Rodolfo (Puccini's *La Bohéme*), Ruggero (Puccini's *La Rondine*), Albert (Britten's *Albert Herring*), and Martin (Copland's *The Tender Land*). Patrick is also regularly seen on the stage of San Francisco Opera and in the classroom as a Teaching Artist with San Francisco Opera Guild. Patrick is overjoyed to join Pocket for his first Eisenstein in *Die Fledermaus*.

#### Melissa Sondhi Adele

Indian-American soprano Melissa Sondhi is thrilled to be returning to Pocket Opera for this wonderful production. Melissa has performed with various opera companies, including Opera San José, Pocket Opera, Lamplighters Music Theatre, and Lyric Theatre of San Jose. This season, she made her debut with the San Francisco Opera Guild as Musetta in *La Bohème*, and returned to Opera San José to cover the role of Nannetta in *Falstaff*. In the 2023-24 season, she will be debuting the roles of Juliette in *Roméo et Juliette*, Gilda in *Rigoletto*, and Rosalba in *Florencia en el Amazonas* with Opera San José.

#### Kevin Gino Alfred

Kevin Gino (He/Him) is an alumnus of the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and has been performing with the greatest talent the Bay Area has to offer, appearing with the San Francisco Opera Chorus, West Edge Opera, Opera San Jose, The American Bach Soloists, Ars Minerva, Philharmonia Baroque, and many others. In addition to performing the great standards of Western Classical repertoire, Gino continues to advocate for marginalized voices inside and outside the classical music community, as well as joyfully representing the Filipino-American and AAPI communities as he seeks opportunities to tell untold stories of People of Color.

Liam is a baritone, composer/arranger, and visual artist from San Luis Obispo. He studied voice with Zachary Gordin, and has recently graduated from Sonoma State University with a BM in vocal performance, with a concentration in composition. # ARTIST PROFILES



#### Leandra Ramm Prince Orlofsky

Leandra Ramm (mezzo-soprano) starred as a soloist in *Ecstacy* at SoundBox (2022), Bernstein's Chichester Psalms (2018) and Bach's Magnificat (2017 and 2023) at San Francisco Symphony. A member of San Francisco Opera Chorus, Ms. Ramm can be heard on the SF Opera Guild cast album of Lucinda y las Flores de la Nochebuena with Albany Records. Recent performances include L'enfant et les Sortileges with Pacific Symphony, Anybodys in West Side Story with Opera San José, and Cunning Little Vixen with West Edge Opera. Concert soloist performances include Durufle's Requiem, Schubert's Miriam's Song of Triumph and Mendelssohn's Drei Geistliche Lieder.



#### Jonathan Spencer Frank

Jonathan Spencer has appeared with Pocket Opera as Agamemnon (La Belle Hélène), Krusina (The Bartered Bride), Ford (The Merry Wives of Windsor), Taddeo (Italian Girl in Algiers), La Rocca (King for a Day), Raimondo (Lucia di Lammermoor), Kromov (The Merry Widow), The Professor (Count Ory), Rambaldo (La Rondine), and Maxie (The Haunted Manor). Each December he plays Squire Bracebridge in The Bracebridge Dinners at Yosemite (returning in 2024). Favorite roles at Lamplighters Music Theatre: Pirate King (The Pirates of Penzance), Judge (Trial by Jury), Pooh-Bah (Mikado), Captain Corcoran (*HMS Pinafore*), and The Playwright (*Enter the Guardsman*).



#### Maria Caycedo Ida

Colombian-American soprano Maria Caycedo was most recently seen as Phyllis in Lamplighter's *lolanthe*, in which she premiered a new aria using recovered libretto material. Other world premieres: Pammy (Finding Medusa), Bette Davis & Quinn (Castle O) and Temple Member in gospel-chamber opera *Heaven Down Here*. Opera roles include: Bernice (L'Occasione fa il Ladro), Adele (Die Fledermaus), Lauretta (Gianni Schicchi), Lucy (The Telephone), Musetta (La Bohème), Frasquita (Carmen), Belinda (Dido & Aeneas), and Sara (La Llorona).
